Call to Order

I. Welcome and Introductions

The following individuals were in attendance: Martina Avila, Nancy Davis, Rhonda Garfield, Elizabeth Lozano, Danny Llamas, Cindee Rael, Penny Miller, Adrian Maldonado, Mark Tompkins and Anne Gonzales.

Council Members Absent: Ariana Avila, Cathy Avina, Bill Bilbo Courtney Kirchman, Maria Stevens.

Rhonda called the meeting to order at 8:35 a.m. and welcomed everyone.

Those present introduced themselves. Ms. Lozano mentioned that the meeting would be recorded for training purposes, and asked if there were any objections. No one had objections.

II. Approve minutes from November 16, 2016

Minutes from the November 16, 2016, DAC minutes were read and approved.

It was motioned, second and passed (MSP) by Anne Gonzales and Nancy Davis (Gonzales, Davis) to accept the November 16, 2016, minutes. (9-0)

III. Technology in the Classrooms Update -(M)

- Mark discussed the CIPA (Children's Internet Protection Act) and how it's our goal to keep the Internet safe for all students.
- He explained the difference between iBoss and Securly, and what SSL encryption is.
- Currently, grades 3-5 are using Securly, which protects students at school and away from school. K-2 will be using teacher-selected web sites only. Any searches to sites not on the "White List" are blocked.
- Liz mentioned that the Internet User Agreement will be updated next year, and is encouraging parents to read what they are signing because even with all the measures that the District has in place, it is not possible to guarantee 100% safety while on the Internet.
- Mark expressed the importance of teachers monitoring what students are doing on their iPads along with the filter. Liz will be requesting that teachers perform random iPad history checks at the end of each day.
- Kindergarten registration is done entirely online this year. In the 2017-18 school year, all grade level registration will be done online.

IV. Dashboard Review and Accountability to SBAC Assessment –(CR)

- Cindee explained Dashboard in detail. She explained the difference between state and local indicators and who inputs the information. She reviewed the significance of the colored pie charts and how to read them, as well as the Met/Not Met for local indicators.
- Cindee explained how to read the five-by-five color grid, and how to use it to set goals.
- Cindee defined what a “gap” was and how to use this information to set goals and move forward.
- She then went to the Dashboard website and showed everyone how to navigate it.
- Ms. Garfield had a question about the High School graduation rate of CUSD students. It was explained to her that our district monitors the middle school dropout information since our district is a K-8 district, and the High School monitors the High School graduation rate.

V. Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) and Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP) -(CR)

- Cindee explained that Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) is how we receive our funding. She then went into detail about what Base Funding, Supplemental Funding, and Concentration Funding were and how it pertains to our district.
- The four Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP) goals were on display and Cindee asked all participants to give their input on each goal, considering the District data just reviewed via the Dashboard.
- Cindee then shared with everyone the input that was received.
- Mark briefly mentioned a website that he recommends parents visit called Common Sense Media, he will go into more detail in the next DAC meeting per the request of Liz.
- Ms. Garfield mentioned that students seem to get into more trouble when there is a substitute, Ms. Lozano said that they are aware of the issue and that new teacher training will be the focus next year so the seasoned teachers will be in the classrooms more throughout the year.
