6. Elections of Members Continued from the November IEC Meeting for 2018/19

- Luis Diaz nominated Noah Ignacio as a parent representative for the IEC meetings. He accepted. A motion was made by Faye Jeff to approve Noah Ignacio as a parent representative and seconded by Danny Llamas. All approved and the motion carried

7. Physical Education Programs CUESD \& LUHSD

- Michelle Kings discussed the high school PE programs.
- For Freshman and Sophomore there is general education
- Juniors and Seniors can go into weight lifting, PE Life-time sport, or sports, band, color guard, or cheerleading
- Valerie Botello discussed PE at Jamison
- PE is for $11^{\text {t }}$ and $12^{\text {* }}$ in and if needed take a health class to eam more credit
- Eam credits for sports also
- Nancy Davis discussed PE for CUESD. It is designed to motivate children to participate in game scenarios and transfer those skills to the general education classroom. The goal is to keep the students'
bodies healthy. The PE teacher is also a member on the Healthy Living Committee and skills learned are done on their own or in general education classroom.


## 8. Science, Technology, Engineering \& Mathematics (STEM) Program- Central \& Stratford

- Nancy Davis discussed the STEM class and shared that students are actively seeking answers to real world questions and are engaged in the learming process. The STEM teacher is shared between Stratford and Central and the sites recently received a $\$ 25,000$ grant which they allotted the monies to a Lego Robotics coding program. Kids are building their own robots and then coding them to perform certain tasks.


## 9. Parent/Community Volunteer Process for CUESD \& LUHSD

- John Raven stated that Central Union has designated 3 level of support in regards to volunteering within the district. The first level is to be able to volunteer in the classroom yet still have a certificated teacher overseeing the activities. Families will have to attend a volunteer training, complete a TB test, and be cleared through Megan's Law. The second level is when families want to volunteer for field trips and at times have a small group without a certificate teacher overseeing the activity. These families must do all the above and also get cleared through the fingerprint process. The third level is for coaches that want to coach after hours and they must complete all the above along with receiving a certificate with CPR training and Concussion training.
- Lemoore High School and Jamison are similar process


## 10. Central, Stratford, \& LUHSD Student Activities Data

- Nancy Davis discussed Central's Native American activities. Central met the participation goal in the following areas: Academic Awards, Character Awards, Girls Basketball, Campus Leadership, \& Health and Wellness. Goals not met in the following areas: Attendance Awards and Boys Basketball. Mrs. Davis proposed that the category Sports be changed to Elective/Sports. She has analyzed the data and noticed that since students have more choices during sports time to choose other electives less students are choosing sport activities. Donzia Morales made a motion to change the category sports to elective/sports and seconded by Danny Llamas. All approved and the motion carried.
- Christina Gonzales discussed Stratford's Native American activities and has incorporated more awards and creating more activities so students feel more connected to the school. In the past there were very few awards and activities so she is positive that they will grow as a school. Stratford met the student goals in the following areas: Character Awards, Girls Basketball, Campus Leadership, Student Portfolio Day, Read Across America. Goals not met: Academic Awards, Attendance Awards, Boys Basketball, \& Winter Holiday Program.
- Lemoore High is tracking Native American participation in school activities and have found that girls basketball girl has 2 Native American players, boys basketball has 2 Native American players, cheerleading they are waiting for roster, no volleyball players, and the Native American club has 30-45 students enrolled
- Jamison- For the $90 \%$ attendance incentives there are 2 Native American students that received this award. In regards to sports there is 1 student participating in soccer, 4 in basketball, 4 in softball, 4 in leadership, and 1 in culinary Mondays.

John Raven discussed that $\$ 231.15$ still needs to be spent for college visits from the current budget.

## 12. Title VI Funding

Nancy Davis reviewed the $18 / 19$ school year budget and stated that any remaining funds need to be spent by June $30^{\circ}$. She discussed the monies allotted for the $19 / 20$ school year and the committee determined

- During passing periods, teachers stand outside his/her classroom door to monitor the hallways.
- Administrators are present in the hallways during passing periods when possible.
- Teachers escort students to the cafeteria, library, computer lab, assemblies, and the bus.
- Yard supervisors are posted at the end of the hallways during recess times.


## Bathroom Monitoring Procedures

- Random bathroom checks are made throughout the day by administrators, teachers, and custodians.
- Yard supervisors are posted outside each restroom during each recess period.
- All K-5th restrooms will have a "two student at a time" rule. 6th-8th have a "one student at a time" rule.
- All restroom doors remain open during the school day.


## Recess Monitoring Procedures

- Yard supervisors report to recess duty two minutes prior to students' arrival.
- Students are monitored by teachers and yard supervisors when exiting to recess.
- Yard supervisors are strategically placed throughout the playground zones, at restrooms, and a hallway entrances.
- Playground zones are designed and followed to separate students of differing age groups.
- Structured Alternative Recesses are utilized and monitored, such as the Wolf Den, Wolves in Training, and the Thinking Track
