6. **Indian Policy and Procedures**

- Nancy Davis stated that the current CUESD policy did not include the (1) parent alternate as an elected position. A discussion was held regarding adding (1) alternate parent representative of non-voting member except in the absence of an elected member. This change will be located on the currently page 2 of the policy.
 - A motion was made by Faye Jeff to add the alternate parent and seconded by Luis Diaz. All approved and the motion carried.
 - Victor Rosa addressed that Lemoore High's IPP already includes having a parent alternate parent.

The CUESD Superintendent responded to the above in writing. This information was briefly shared with the IEC members. The members were informed the information will be located on the CUESD website if they would like to further review.

7. Update on Indian Education Committee/Council Name

- Nancy Davis discussed changing the name from committee to council as the Federal Government refers to the Indian Education Committee as a Council. We are aligning our language to that of the Federal Government. Minimum discussion was held. All members acknowledged the need for the change.

8. Elections of Members Continued from the September IEC Meeting for 2018/19

- The election of the alternate parent will be moved to November 2018 meeting, as there were not any parents in attendance that were not already elected as an IEC Member. Mr. Llamas
- Nancy Davis nominated Luis Diaz as the Chairman and he accepted. A motion was made by Erin Ferreira to approve Luis Diaz and seconded by Danny Llamas. All approved and the motion carried.
- Nancy Davis nominated Danny Llamas as Vice Chairman and he accepted. A motion was made by Victor Rosa to approve Danny Llamas and seconded by Erin Ferreira. All approved and the motion carried.
- Nancy Davis nominated Erin Ferreira as secretary and she accepted. A motion was made by Danny Llamas to approve Erin Ferreira and Donzia Morales seconded it. All approved and the motion carried. Morales

9. Student Activities Data Plan for Continued Improvement

- Nancy Davis discussed Central's plan for reviewing the participation of Native American students in the following areas: Reward Programs, Sports Activities, Leadership Programs and Activities, Honor Roll Trips, and Academic Enrichment
- Christina Gonzales discussed Stratford's plan. Stratford is looking at the participation rate of the of Native American students in the following areas: Reward Programs, Sport Activities, and Academic Enrichment.
- Elaine Jeff discussed reaching out to SRR Cultural Department for any assistance with the Native American Student Service Learning activities that Central discussed.

10. Uniform Complaint Procedure

- Nancy Davis discussed the board policy in regards to Uniform Complaint Procedures. Mrs. Davis stated the goal is to always try to address all parent concerns or needs at the site level. When that is not possible parents have a right to make a formal complaint. Once the progress begins there is a timeline for all responsible parties to resolve the concern. The schools will assist parents with the paperwork if needed.
- Victor Rosa stated that Lemoore High School has the same policy.

- Nancy Davis discussed the Bylaws and focused on the two changes. The name will be amended from Committee to Council and the date will reflect October 16, 2018. No other changes were noted. 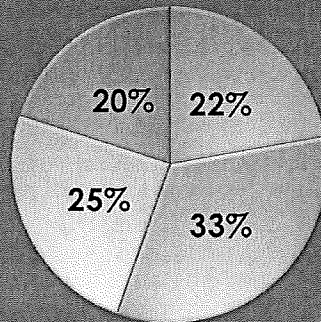

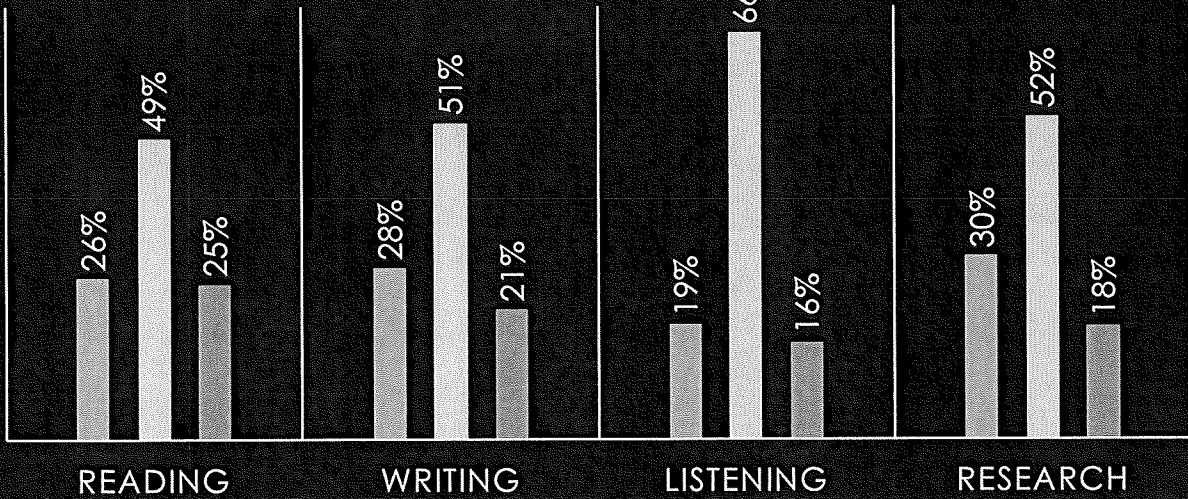

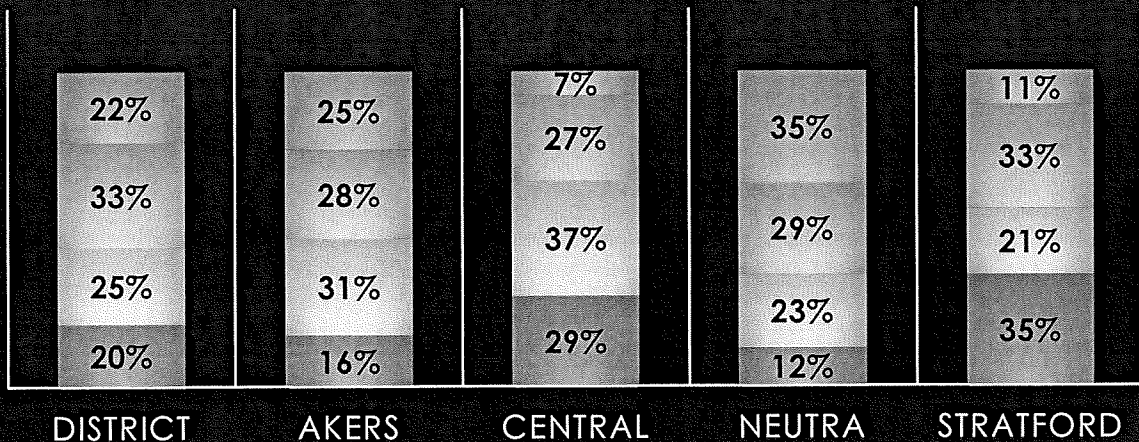
CUSD READING BY AREA

CUSD READING BY SITE

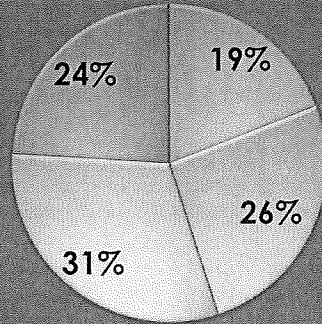

■ Above Standard ■ Near Standard ■ Below Standard



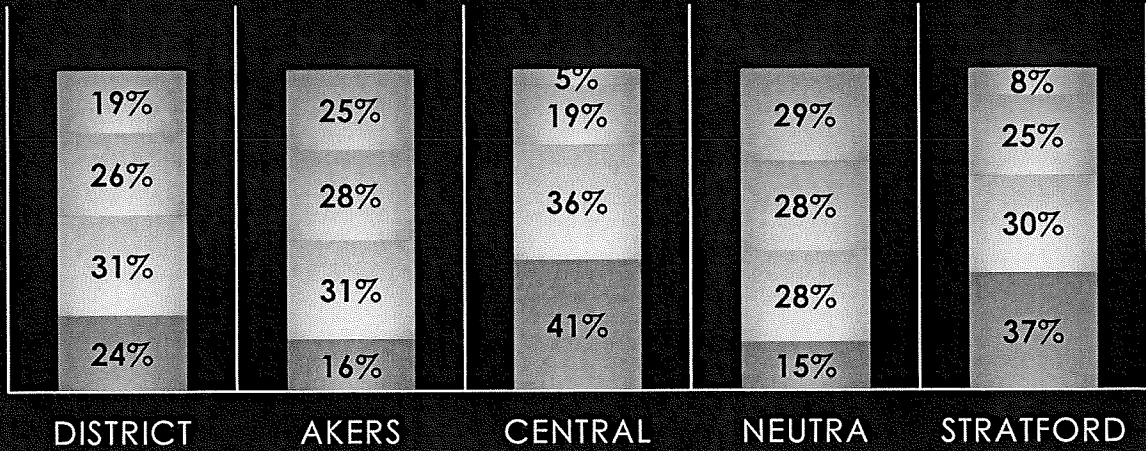
