1. Call to Order

- Meeting was called to order at 12:34pm

2. Additions, Deletions, and Approval of Agenda

3. Approval of the Minutes from the Previous IEC Meeting

A motion was made by Erin Ferreira to approve the September 2019 minutes and seconded by Danny Llamas. All approved and the motion carried.

4. Introductions of Guests

5. Guest Reports or Communications

Presentation from Gadgil Lab Team- They discussed the three-year grant project with the district to eliminate arsenic from the water source at Central Union Elementary School District. Their technology and testing has shown reduction of arsenic to safe drinking level in rural parts of India. They will also educate the students and community about their technology.

6. Indian Policy and Procedures

- Elizabethe Lozano discussed the policy and stated that two notifications were received without any concerns. They will now post on the website for the public and send notices home to parents in November. The last process will be discussing the policy with the board for approval.
 - o A motion was made by Erin Ferreira to approve the policy as presented and seconded by Danny Llamas. All approved and the motion carried.
- Charles Gent discussed Lemoore High School's board policy and stated that it was very similar to Central Elementary's policy. Lemoore High School reviewed the policy at the last school board meeting and it was approved by the board. They sent out their notices to parents for input at the beginning of the year so they can align the policy with their LCAP.
 - o A motion was made by Erin Ferreira to approve the policy as presented and seconded by Danny Llamas. All approved and the motion carried.

7. Uniform Complaint Procedure

• Christina Gonzales discussed the complaint procedures of how parents can provide written documentation and then the site and district will have time to review the documentation. The school board will have the final decision if the complaint was not satisfied at the site or district level.
