IEC Meeting Minutes
3/15/22

1. Call to Order:

- a. Time: 12:36pm
- b. Roll Call – Present were: Danny Llamas, Cindee Rael, Elizabeth Quair, Epifanio Quair, Valerie Botelho, Rodney Brumit, Sonia Gonzalez, Noah Ignacio, Christina Gonzales, Joseph Gonzalez, Tanya Williams, Donzia Morales, Anne Gonzales, Caleb Sisco and Elizabeth Alvarado
- c. A quorum of members was established

2. Additions/Deletions and Approval of Agenda:

A change to the agenda was noted to items 12 and 13. Item 13 was deleted from the agenda as it duplicated the same item in number 12. A motion was made by Elizabeth Quair, seconded by Noah Ignacio. Motion passed.

3. Approval of the Minutes:

Cindee Rael noted a clarification to the minutes to section 6. She reported that the minutes need to reflect the wording of “No change in LCFF funding”. A motion was made by Donzia Morales to accept the minutes with the noted clarification. The motion was seconded by Elizabeth Quair. Motion passed.

4. Introductions of Guests: None

5. Parent Involvement:

Mrs. Rael presented information regarding upcoming the SEL lessons for parents. She reported this opportunity for parent engagement and involvement was sponsored by CUSD.

6. Local Control Accountability Plan 2022-2023 CUESD & LUHSD:

- a. CUSD: Mrs. Rael reviewed the need for feedback from the IEC on the various LCAP actions. Attendees were asked to participate in the activity to assist in better understanding goals under the LCAP and indicate from their viewpoint if goals are being met or need more refinement. Participants provided feedback.
- b. LUHSD: Mr. Brumit reported LHS utilized parent square to understand information from parents their feedback.

7. Universal Pre-Kindergarten (UPK) & Expanded Learning Opportunities (ELO):

Mrs. Rael presented that the CUSD is in process of working on UPK. She reported the eligibility of a child’s DOB has moved for the 22/23 school year to February 2nd and must be 5 years of age to be eligible for TK. Subsequent school years will also be changed and moves to April 2/2 for the 23/24 school year and June 2 for the 24/25 school year. The state’s goal is that all 4 year-old’s will have access to a PK year before Kindergarten.

The ELO is for students beyond the school day to assist with homework help, field trips to experience things to connect to academic content. This program would provide an extended window of time that students would have experiences and resources adding up to 3 hours to make a 9-hour day and 30 days after the school year. Currently enrolled TK – 5th grade parents will be getting a survey regarding parent square. This information is important to get back as soon as possible as it will provide data back for set up for staffing. This plan is different from other programs which is focused around family needs so program may be developed around them.

8. Student Attendance Review Board:

- a. Mrs. Rael reviewed the various definitions and reasons why students are absent and what situations may constitute an absence. CUSD Board Policies were reviewed as well as the SARB process and attendance procedures both at District and school site level.
- b. Lemoore High school described the process for attendance procedures and how they track students of concern. Mr. Brumit discussed the resources involved and how to navigate cases taken to SARB. He stressed the need for attendance as credit recovery is urgent in some cases.

9. American Indian Early Childhood Education (AIECE) Gr. K – 4th:

Mrs. Anne Gonzales reported the AIECE grant. She reported during the 20/21 school year Central was reinstated an award of \$49,416.66 which was spent on items including:

- Technology apps focused on math skills and reading/vocabulary
- Student material packets – literature books, vocabulary, reading and math
- Kinder – 4th grade classroom libraries and school library allocations
- Kinder – 2nd grade for Family Story Hours

Mrs. Gonzales reported Dr. Sidhu has been in contact with the California Department of Education AIECE office to review the current school year and potential funding. She has been notified the 21/22 school year has been funded and is awaiting response about the possibility of extending the timeline.

10. Johnson-O'Malley (JOM) Funding for Native American Students:

Mrs. Rael reported funds are available and need to be spent. In total there is \$12,746 available for spending to support students and increase achievement. Mrs. Rael reviewed with the IEC current data in the area of reading and math that may be used to assist in developing resources and services for students. Members present provided the following suggestions:

- a. Continue to assist students with intervention
- b. Mental health services to school site and after school
- c. Enrichment services and literacy night to offer to students

**11. Title VI Funding for Native American Students:

- a. Danny Llamas reported the expenses for various student activities to date. He discussed the planning for student services that will be taking place for the upcoming months. Summer school for high school was discussed and the design of the program which students may decide to take advantage of before starting campus. Great opportunity for incoming freshman through the summer bridge program which may run for three weeks in person.

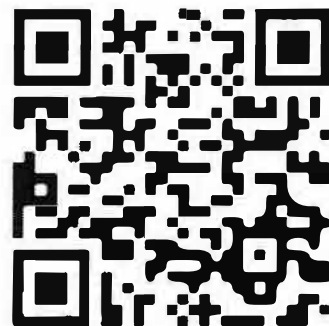

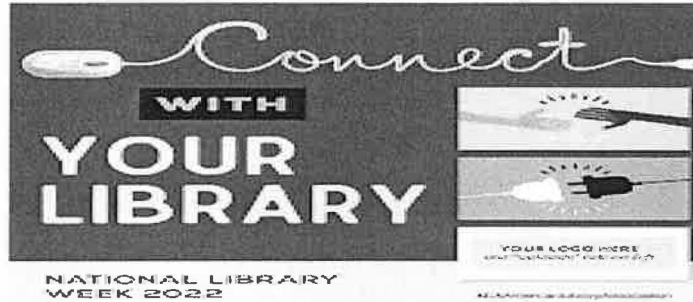
