1. Call to Order:

5. Student Achievement Update – Reading Mastery Grades K-2:

Mrs. Rael shared K-2 Reading Mastery Data including Native Student Group. Many students are performing Below Standards. Native student

6. Educational Focus Next Year – CUESD & LUHSD:

a. LUHSD: Mr. Gent

The most important challenge for HS at this time is preparing students for college and/or jobs. They are focusing on identifying the specific needs of students. The HS is also seeing attendance and social emotional learning. The HS is looking at equity and access for student in CTC and other programs. They will be attending a training which liaisons may be included in. The training will help them identify barriers for access for students and how to address them.

Brummit – Based on AB_____ School must begin at 8:30am beginning next year. They will be running a block schedule. A positive result of this new schedule is a 30-minute homeroom period each day. Students will be working on collecting information to upload for CCGI. More opportunity for developing citizenship an intervention period built into the school day. The intervention period will also allow for students involved in various activities to make up a test or missed learning.

b. CUESD: Mrs. Sidhu

The academic focus as we are ramping up will begin with the social emotional learning and sense of belonging to increase attendance. We are looking at student leadership – students having more of a voice again to increase belonging and attendance. We have 3 days of PL offered to all teachers, about half have signed up. The first 2 days will have key PL and the last day is planning with their PLC team. This will allow teachers to be very prepared as students come in. We also have some shifts in our Early Learning – TK. Assessments throughout the year to monitor student progress ongoing.

7. District Volunteer Processes for CUESD & LUHSD:

- a. LUHSD: Mr. Brummit explained the process beginning with being sponsored by a coach for those who will be alone with students.
- b. Central: There is a presentation for all parents and a background check. We talk about student confidentiality and expectations on campus. To be a chaperone on a field trip with a group of students separate from the teacher, a fingerprint clearance is completed.

8. Student Activity Data for CUESD & LUHSD:

- a. LUHSD: Jamison shared their student activity data. In each area, except Leadership, Native students participated at an equal or higher rate. Leadership 0% of Native participated.
- b. CUESD: Central's student activity data was shared by Loretta Black. Mrs. Gonzales shared the student activity data for Stratford. Stratford met or exceeded their goals for Native students participating. Higher participation of Native students in Basketball than all students.

9. Local Control and Accountability Plan 2022 - 2023:

Committee members were provided opportunity for any additional input for the 2022-23 LCAP.

10. Extended Learning Opportunity (ELO):

- b. High School ELO Plan aligned with LCAP. All plans aligned along the same goals.

11. Importance of Attendance:

Mrs. Black shared Chronic Absenteeism rate by month for Central by school, district and for Native American Students. Students cannot learn when they are not in school.

12. American Indian Early Childhood Education (AIECE) Program 2021 – 2022 Update:

Dr. Sidhu shared for Mrs. Gonzales, Principal Central. This is a grant for Central in grades K-4. An extension has been provided to extend 2021-22 funds to the 2022-23 year. The committee reviewed the proposal for expenditure of the funds and were provided an opportunity to give input.

13. Johnson-O-Malley (JOM) Funding for Native American Students Business and reporting (Budget to be Provided)

Dr. Sidhu shared the funding update including date, funds received, funds expended, and current balance. She asked the committee is they would be in agreement with her reaching out to site administrators since they are the closest to student and know needs for ideas on how expend these funds. Danny shared how they had previously provided books and this was positively received.

Before the Ceremony

- 1. Seniors to arrive at the Main Gym lobby prior to the ceremony.
 - a. Cap and Gown IN HAND, not on yet, dressed appropriately (the expectations below are from the Senior Exit Interview Criteria) seniors not complying will not be allowed to line up for the ceremony
 - Appropriate Commencement Attire
 Men: Dress shirt; slacks, khakis, belt, tie; hair away from the face;
 all piercings removed, including earrings; tennis shoes are fine if
 they are dark, clean, and tied properly; NO SHORTS
 Women: Dress, skirt, or business suit; dark slacks; small amount
 of jewelry; appropriate dress shoes (heels will be problematic
 walking on the grass)
- 2. Prior to putting on the cap and gown, seniors will be searched (including a "pat down"); contraband items will be confiscated, and the **senior risks being pulled from the ceremony**
 - a. No Adornments other than those provided by the school (CSF stole, honor cords, awards medallions)
 - b. No Beach Balls, balloons, noise makers, silly string, etc.—nothing that will/could be used to disrupt the ceremony
- 3. Once the search is complete, Seniors will be given an identifier that certifies that they have completed steps 1 and 2, and are then to put on the cap and gown
- 4. Seniors will go out to the courts east of the Event Center locker rooms to line up in the rehearsed order; any senior in the line without the "identifier" will be removed from the line, and will not be in the ceremony
- 5. No senior will be allowed in the line unless they have been searched prior to the line beginning to move.

During the Ceremony

- b. Not disrupt the speeches or the announcement of names
- c. Conduct themselves in a manner appropriate for the ceremony
